### *May 11<sup>th</sup> Congregational Gathering: Destiny Stands at the Door*

The Pastor's article for the last week in April ended with the following: “On **Wednesday, May 11<sup>th</sup>, at 5 pm** we will gather for a pot luck meal followed by some time to start to discern where the priorities are in our ministry, what gifts we have to offer, and what types of gifts do we need in a leader to take full advantage of the opportunities to which God is calling us. It will only cost us a couple of hours, but the benefits could last a lifetime!” *Please note that we will have a Zoom option for those who may be traveling or unable to attend in person, though we urge you to attend in person if possible.*

As you might guess, that article which was sent out to everyone, gives some build up to this event. But that article is more big-picture in scope—putting this gathering in the context of the whole year of transition. Still, some of you may be wondering more specifically what that event is about.

First of all, it's on a Wednesday evening so it won't interfere with weekend plans and is slated to start at 5 pm so folks can get to the church after work. We're going to gather as a church community for a pot luck meal to get us fueled up for the next hour and a half or so. We'll have our newly designated Transition Team with us to add some wisdom to the discussion.

Content-wise, all you need to bring is your imagination! As a congregation, our goal for this evening is to start to set the agenda for the search for a new Pastor. That process begins with a very simple task: to assess what assets Petersburg Lutheran Church possesses and what priorities the congregation has, looking toward the future of ministry in the here and now. There is a deliberate exercise for helping us gather and to discuss how those opportunities will impact the search for a new Pastor as well as our immediate agenda. We NEED your participation!

**Please mark your calendars and make this evening an event to remember!**

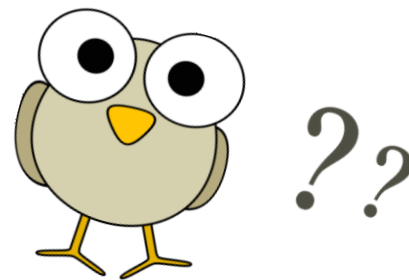

## Other Events in May

The **National Day of Prayer** is Thursday, May 5<sup>th</sup> this year, sponsored by the Petersburg Ministerial Association. Please gather at the Forest Service flag pole at 7 am, and the service will last about 20-30 minutes.



At the start of the **Little Norway Festival**, Pastor Zach from Petersburg Lutheran and Pastor Nathan from the Lighthouse Church are working on a memorial to primarily honor all those who died since the Covid pandemic began. Many people were unable to be honored by services of any kind, so the hope is to have a cross with greenery available for folks to place a flower on in memory of loved ones.

**Vacation:** Pastor Zach and Karen will be attending their son, Ryan's Graduation in Boston from May 23-28 (Monday through Saturday). They are also going on a 10-day excursion to see a little more of Alaska starting June 6 through June 17. Mark Kubo will be the guest preacher on June 12<sup>th</sup> while Pastor Zach is away.

## May 11 Congregational Meeting - A Key Transition Event

Have you even been in an amusement park Fun House, with all the wacky mirrors – the ones that make us look short and fat (I hate that one!) or the ones that make us look long and lean (my favorite!), or the ones that make us look all wavy? Do you ever see yourself in a mirror someplace with very bright lighting, and see things that you don't notice in your mirror at home? A big part of Pastor Zach's role in this Transition process is to hold a mirror up to us and to help us see ourselves as we really are, rather than the version of ourselves that we imagine. Honest self-examination is crucial to accurately describe who we are as a church, and what our goals are (for the Mission Site Profile paperwork), which will become the basis for Calling our new Pastor.

For this Transition period, the Interim Pastor that Bishop Shelley recommended to us was someone with specific training and experience as an Intentional Interim and Mission Developer, which may be a new experience for us. Petersburg Lutheran knows how to move through the phases of a Transition and Call, but perhaps Pastor Zach has some unique perspectives and insights to help us approach the process a little differently than we have in the past. Change is uncomfortable and disruptive, and we're all anxious to put this period behind us, but I urge us all to be patient with Pastor Zach's approach and to embrace it. We all hope and pray that this Transition and Call process will help us find a Pastor that will be with us for a very long time, but right now, we have to roll up our sleeves and think and pray and come together to work with one another.

***We must gather, as a congregation, and talk about what's important to us, and where we currently are – that's what's going to happen on May 11th.*** How do we see ourselves, and how do others see us? What role do we play in the community? How do we want to proceed in the future? Pastor Zach is here to help guide us in those discussions. His weekly "Through a Lutheran Lens" articles, sermons, and Lenten talks have all been laying the groundwork for where we are at this point in the Transition process. All those words are intended to get us thinking deeply about what Transition means and where it can lead us. I urge you to go back and read them and/or watch the videos.

While Pastor Zach's methods seem different and more ponderous than past Transitions, I hope we will put our trust in him to guide us, and that we will participate with enthusiasm. It's crucial that members of our congregation get INVOLVED so that when we are ready to Call a new Pastor, we will find an excellent match between Petersburg Lutheran's needs that align with the insights and skills of the new Pastor.

## Time, Talents, and Treasures

The church sent out an email in March asking everyone to look at the attached "Time and Talents" sheet and explanations, so we can learn who can serve in what capacities at PLC. This information is vital to find out who is interested in what ministries at church in the form of volunteering. To date, the response has been underwhelming, so PLEASE give this request prayerful thought and send in your response. Our church can not survive without *involvement* by our members! Everyone has something they can contribute – skills, knowledge, energy, or experience, or ???. Even if you can only help out a little bit, or make phone calls, or write to shut-ins, or don't have many skills but are willing to learn – your church needs YOU! Ask questions of your Council members... ask our Pastor... ask the volunteers who always seem to be involved - to learn more about how you can help your church.

## Financial Report

PLC has started the new year “in the red,” – spending more than we received in the first Quarter of the year. *Please give prayerful thought to increasing your support of the Church and its missions.*

25%: \$1416.46 for Monday Night Meals  
25%: \$1416.46 to Humanity in Progress
