Council Highlights

The Church Council met on Wednesday, August 17th and discussed the following:

- Thank you to Dave and Nancy Berg, Bev Siercks, John Swanson, and Katey Gilpin for helping with insulation at the parsonage on Saturday, August 13.
- President Bev Siercks reported that the Membership Roll has been updated with 253 members and 130 voting members, so 26 voting members are needed for the special congregational meeting on September 25th, 2022.
- Pastor Zach, his wife Karen, and their dog Huck will begin their exit strategy by heading out on the ferry to Prince Rupert with their truck on September 12th. Pastor Zach is planning to return Saturday, September 17th, 2022. Pastor Zach stated that he will be here until the Call Committee is in place and all the paperwork is in order to move forward with the call of a new pastor.
- The Council will meet on Wednesday, August 24th, 2022 to pray about the names and select the remainder of the Call Committee.
- Future Events: Blessing of students and teachers on Sunday, August 28th, 2022, Baptism of Beckett Thain on Sunday, September 18th, 2022.
- A date has been set for the Good Beginnings 25th Anniversary celebration: Sunday, November 13th, 2022.
- Council voted to suspend the monthly benevolence that PLC gives to Good Beginnings (during the 9-month school year), for the remainder of the calendar year. This is due to the good financial health of Good Beginnings, and can be resumed at any time as needed.
- Council discussed improvements needed at the parsonage.
- ELCA's "God's Work. Our Hands."- a family event - is scheduled for September 11, 2022. Council decided to create a list of projects around the church, the parsonage, and the Rebi Hus that need to be done.
- Six-Month Evaluation of Transition was discussed by Council and Pastor Zach.

Planning for the Future

In the past two years, our family has experienced two deaths that were significantly impacted by end-of-life planning. In one case the person’s final illness, passing, funeral, and disposition of their estate was managed in accordance with their wishes, and understood by their loved ones – because they had an up-to-date Will, Advanced Medical Directive, and other health care and end-of-life documents in order. The other death occurred after a tragic accident, where the person fell and hit their head. They were found and taken to the hospital in a coma, but the hospital had no idea who to contact on their behalf. It took four days for our family to find out, possibly delaying critical health care decisions. Ultimately, this person only marginally awakened from the coma, and passed away a few months later. Unlike the first family member, this person did not have an Advanced Health Care Directive or a designated health care proxy to make decisions for them. A brother had to go to court and go through a lengthy and expensive process to be named the person’s Guardian, in order to make health care decisions while the person was still alive but unable to act for themselves. Our family had no idea about the person’s

wishes as we were faced with making some gut-wrenching decisions. After the person died, all the decisions about this person's estate were left to the state's courts because there was no Will.

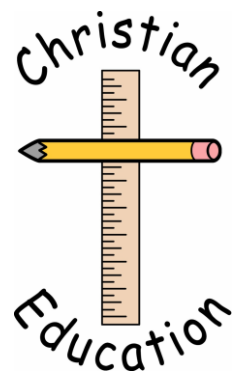
Have you made a Will, completed an Advanced Health Care Directive (such as [Five Wishes](#), available online or at Petersburg Medical Center clinic), or prepared any other end-of-life documents? If you already have these documents, *have you kept them up to date?* It shouldn't be morbid or depressing to talk about what happens to our body and our possessions when we die – we all will die one day, and go on to the Great Reward that awaits us in God's Kingdom.

It's important to give your loved ones guidance about what your wishes are, to help them when they are experiencing shock and grief, reeling from your loss or a traumatic injury. It's a great kindness to tell them what to do with your mortal remains, what kind of funeral you want, which readings and hymns have meaning for you, etc. It's also important to provide guidance about how to distribute the assets you leave behind, to help ease decisions that can be overwhelming, emotionally charged, or divisive for families. Planning for the future, and updating that plan periodically can make a huge difference in your care and quality of life at life's end, and will make a very difficult job much easier for your loved ones left behind.

As you consider what to do with your assets after you pass on, consider donating part of your estate to your church. A gift directed to specific things that are important to you or given to the church to use however it needs, will make a great impact on the church and its good works. September's Prayer Partner is the Alaska Synod's [Mesa Sagrada](#). Mesa Sagrada (Sacred Table in Spanish) is a group of folks who gather the second Saturday of each month at 5 PM for dinner church. They share a meal, discuss a Scripture passage around the table and then share in Holy Communion. Everyone is welcome at this table. Folks come from diverse backgrounds, ethnicities and church traditions. Some folks have no church tradition and just want to learn more and be in fellowship with others along the way. Children join in the conversation, or are welcome to play in another part of the dining room. There's a place for everyone here.

Mesa Sagrada is a Synodically Authorized Worshipping Community of the Alaska Synod, ELCA. During the year, leaders from Mesa also host several traditional Latin festivals, such as Dia de los Muertos and Las Posadas. Mesa meets at Trinity Lutheran Church in Palmer, 10355 E Palmer-Wasilla Highway.

ELCA News

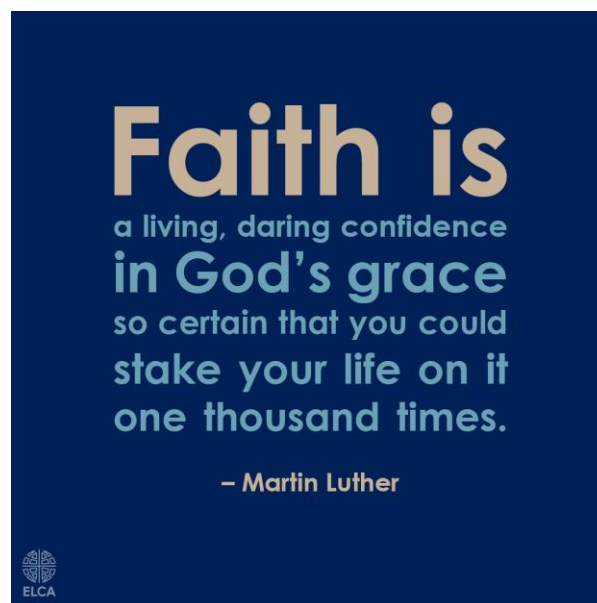
